

2024 was a year of remarkable progress for Marin Foster Care Association (MFCA) and the wider community we serve. We remained steadfast in our mission, reaching more foster children and caregivers than ever before. These accomplishments are a collective effort, and we extend our heartfelt gratitude to our partners, donors, volunteers, and supporters who have been integral to our success. Our 2024 achievements include:

- Caring for over 175 children in Marin's foster care program. Our growing team has created opportunities for joy, support, and connection, so that our foster youth can be seen, heard and loved.
- Enhancing our Opportunity Project budget over the previous year. Even more foster children had access to academic support and enrichment activities in our supportive community.
- Doubling the number of visitors to our Community Resource Center a place where everything a foster child needs is available at no cost.
- Extending our Caregiver Support program, responding to increased needs, and making sure over 100 foster families had what they needed to continue to provide quality care for their foster children.
- Increasing our impact, thanks to the success of our two-night annual fundraiser,
 Blues & Brews, which raised over \$475,000 through auctions, raffles, donations, and sponsorships.
- Expanding our therapy program, Fostering Interconnection Through Therapy (FITT), a program designed exclusively to provide therapeutic support for families who open their homes to foster children. We have three therapists serving over 25 families weekly with a dedicated therapy room in our building.
- Launching San Francisco's own Community Resource Center to serve even more Bay Area foster families. Now, hundreds more foster youth and their families will have access to the items they need to thrive.
- Moving six young adults into our newly acquired 10-unit apartment building
 for aging-out foster youth to support their path to successful independence. This
 groundbreaking project provides stable, affordable housing for youth aging out of
 the foster care system, who without MFCA face substantial difficulties in renting
 apartments from landlords.

While we've made significant strides, our work is far from over. There are still many lives to impact and transform. As we continue to provide vital resources and support to the foster care community, we are grateful for your unwavering commitment in 2024. We look forward to having you alongside us as we advance this mission in 2025 and beyond.








QUARTERLY GATHERING AT THE POOL

BLUES & BREWS










FOREVER FAMILIES


